NJWLA Member, Rosemary E. Ramsay, Sworn In As Judge of the Superior Court

MORRISTOWN - June 22, 2007: Rosemary E. Ramsay was sworn in as Judge of the Superior Court on Friday, June 22, 2007, in Morris County. Ms. Ramsay, 47, of Hanover, was nominated by Gov. Jon Corzine to sit on the bench in the Morris-Sussex County court vicinage. One of three female jurists in the 22-judge vicinage, she will preside over matters in the family division of Superior Court in Morris County.



Some 200 friends and supporters turned out for the ceremony, where Ms. Ramsay was given the oath of office by retired state Supreme Court Justice Robert L. Clifford, for whom she clerked between 1989-90. Ms. Ramsay was presented with her judicial robe by her partner, Jayne S. Deo.

Ms. Ramsay worked for Lowenstein Sandler P.C. in Roseland for the past 17 years, the last 10 years as a partner. She represented corporations and individuals in complex litigation involving products liability, mass torts, toxic torts, environmental science and commercial or consumer fraud.

Dozens of Ms. Ramsay's friends, colleagues from Lowenstein Sandler, and members of the New Jersey Women Lawyers Association (NJWLA) were at the ceremony. She thanked her friends and family for nurturing her academic and emotional growth, the NJWLA, Kirsten Scheurer Branigan, President of the NJWLA and Desha Jackson, President-Elect of the NJWLA, for their support and the association's endorsement.

Ms. Ramsay is a member of the New Jersey Women Lawyers Association. She served as Chief Operations Officer on the Board of Trustees from June 2006 to May 2007. The New Jersey Women Lawyers Association is an independent association of New Jersey women lawyers. The association's mission is to retain women in the legal profession through education and activism, to promote members to the highest levels of law firm, government, academic, community and corporate positions and to endorse qualified female attorneys for appointment to the state and federal judiciary. ♣
