### NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: One (1)

**DUTIES:** Under direction of Executive Director of the Office of Public Integrity and Accountability, Counsel for the Police Training Commission (PTC), and/or the Administrator of the PTC, or other supervisory official, will be responsible for litigation and contested matters pertaining to PTC rules and regulations and other complex legal matters related to police licensing. In addition, this supervisory position will include: the review of documentation in reference to the suspension and/or revocation of law enforcement licensees; presentation on behalf of the PTC at hearings concerning contested licensure matters; acting as consultant in the development of basic law enforcement courses and in-service training programs; serving on various task forces and working groups for PTC or the Department of Law & Public Safety; working on special projects and initiatives; and performing other related legal work as required. This position may also require nontraditional work hours, on an as needed basis, including evenings and weekends on short deadlines for certain assignments, with or without advance notice.

## **REQUIREMENTS**

**EDUCATION:** Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor. Admission to practice as an Attorney at Law in the State of New Jersey is required.

**EXPERIENCE:** Four (4) years of experience as a practicing attorney, one (1) year of which shall have been in a supervisory capacity.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

**PREFERENCE:** Preference will be given to candidates who have prior experience with regulations, administrative hearings and/or working with licensing regimes.

<u>SAME APPLICANTS</u>: If you are applying under the NJ CSC "SAME" program, your Schedule A or B letter must be submitted along with your resume and any other required supporting documents indicated on the announcement by the closing date indicated above.
