2015 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

NJWLA has established a scholarship program to benefit students who are pursuing juris doctorate degrees. In 2015, NJWLA intends to award grants of \$5,000 each, to one student from each of New Jersey's law schools: Rutgers University Law School – Camden; Rutgers University Law School – Newark; and Seton Hall University Law School.

In order to qualify, each nominee must be a matriculating law school student who:

- Has completed at least twelve (12) credits at the time of application;
- Is carrying a minimum of six (6) credits per term; and
- Has been recommended by a professor, an instructor, an adjunct faculty member, a clinical instructor, a Dean, a Director of their law school or has been recommended by a lawyer or a judge (either needs to have at least ten (10) years experience) with whom you have worked (1) as a clerk or intern for at least three (3) months during the past two (2) years.

SELECTION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

In addition to these requirements, applicants will be judged according to their commitment and dedication to their law school and the practice of law as well as his/her essay.

Scholarship awards may be used for tuition, fees, books, and personal expenses, and are given directly to the students.

Applicants who work for companies that offer tuition reimbursement are eligible to apply.

Scholarship application forms are mailed to Deans of New Jersey's three law schools and are also available on our website at <u>www.njwla.org</u>.

PREVIOUS WINNERS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE.

All applications must be *received* by January 9, 2015 at 5:00 pm. No exceptions.

All winners are expected to attend the NJWLA Gala on March 24, 2015 at The Grove in Cedar Grove, New Jersey, at which event they will be recognized.



Incomplete applications and/or applications postmarked and/or received after the deadline WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

There will be no exceptions.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

Multiple reviewers will review each application. Your application package must contain one (1) original of your:

- Application

- Letter of recommendation
- Law school transcript (first year students should submit undergraduate transcript) (Letter of recommendation and transcript must be original and must be mailed to the postal address below.)

February 2015 – All candidates and Deans will be notified of the outcome of the application review.
